What is UNU-INWEH?


- Created: 1996

- Ensuring gender equity







Composition:

- Members: 28 UN agencies
- Partners: 24 International Water Organizations

Objective:

Strengthen coordination and coherence among UN entities dealing with issues related to all aspects of freshwater and sanitation

□ Focus:

- Surface and groundwater resources
- Interface between freshwater and seawater
- Water-related disasters



UN-Water Strategic Directions

- Interface with and inform global policy processes inside and outside the UN system
- Facilitate delivery of technical support and implementation at the country level
- Continued enhancement in coordination and coherence at the UN system level
